State Convention: Registration will be live on Monday @ 9am! The promotional poster for State Convention was mailed to all of our chapters yesterday. You should receive them early next week! Schedules, engagement opportunities, competitions and more have all been posted! Please review all of this information with your students so that you can be prepared to register them for the appropriate activities. Registration closes April 9th. The official hotel of the 2018 convention has had a name change, it is now the Rochester Riverside Hotel. This facility is ideally located to all convention venues with direct access via skywalk to the convention center with a short walk to the Blue Cross Arena. Most workshops and LDE/CDE's will be held in either the Rochester Riverside Hotel or Convention Center. In order to receive the reduced rate that includes breakfast you must reserve your rooms by 3/30/18. FFA Membership: Even though the roster deadline has passed, chapters can continue to add members until August 1st after paying a \$50 late fee. **We will be checking rosters for members advancing to Sub-States and State Convention, please make sure these students are on your roster.** There have been many updates and changes to

the system. Please read **ALL** of the following information carefully so that this transition can be as smooth of a process as possible. As our state continues to see growth in our membership, we are starting to see some overlap with our homeschools and BOCES centers having students in two programs. A new policy that took affect September 1st is, 7-12th grade members must be added to the national roster, only 6th graders can be added to the NY Only Roster.

DISTRICT AND SUBSTATE SNOW/ INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Schools need to notify the host by noon of the day prior to your event if they are unable to attend (travel to the event, if it is a weekend) because of inclement weather causing a school to close. **Even if one school is unable to attend, the competitions need to be moved to the snow date.** If you have selected a snow date

that falls after the manuscript due date, students will have 24 hours after your event to submit their manuscripts to Catie Rowe at cmr323@cornell.edu. If your snow date falls on a weekend, you have until midnight of the next school day (the following Monday) to submit them. If manuscripts are submitted any later than this, we cannot guarantee that they will be evaluated and all late penalties will apply. ALL substate manuscripts must be submitted via email, in PDF format to me no later than 11:59pm on March 7th, unless your district has to move to your snow date.

The full snow date policy reads as such: "Every district must have a date and a snow date by October 1st submitted to State FFA and recommend that there be at least a week between those dates at the discretion of the host site. In case of inclement weather causing not 100% of the schools to be eligible to participate in district and sub-state competitions, schools need to contact host site by noon the day prior of the event. Should this occur, the event would move to the snow date."

NEW FOR 2018- Agricultural Education/ Teach Ag LDE preview event at Sub States

At the January meeting, the board voted to adopt the Agricultural Education/ Teach Ag LDE as an exploratory event at the Sub State level. At this level, students will be scored but will not receive a rank or official placing- this is just a practice of the event. Any student that is interested in participating in this event should submit their written speech manuscript to the Sub-State hosts 10 days prior to the event. The Agricultural Education/Teach Ag LDE will officially begin at State Convention, students will receive a score and a rank at the state level. This is not a National competition.

3. National FFA and American Farmland Trust Forms Partnership

The National FFA Organization and American Farmland Trust (AFT) signed a memorandum of understanding this week to cooperate and collaborate for the next five years. The two organizations pledged to work together toward the common goal of strengthening agriculture and seeking mutually beneficial opportunities for AFT and FFA members and agricultural education students. The agreement allows FFA to retain AFT for its conservation expertise on projects involving gifts of farm or ranch land to FFA. The goal is to help potential donors achieve conservation objectives in the context of a planned gift of farm or ranch land.

7. Chapters Living to Serve During National FFA Week

Whiteland FFA, Indiana

To support a fellow student, Whiteland FFA is collecting supplies for 100 "Emma's Art Kits." Emma created an organization that collects art supplies for children's hospitals, after spending time in one herself. During National FFA Week, FFA members are helping her reach her goal of donating 150,000 art kits.

Kenmare FFA, North Dakota

Kenmare FFA is working with local partners to improve apartments at a local community housing facility. The apartments are part of a nonprofit that helps house community members in need. FFA members are providing much-needed volunteer hours to help ensure a clean and safe environment for those using the facility.

8. Third Annual Give FFA Day a Success

On Tuesday, National FFA held a 24-hour giving event to raise money during National FFA Week. Activities included live interviews and leaderboard updates on Facebook Live from the National FFA Center, multiple matching challenges from generous donors and lots of advocacy on behalf of FFA Ambassadors on social media. Though we are still waiting on final numbers from Facebook donations, at this time, we can report more than \$160,000 raised! More than 200 donors contributed during this day of giving. 9. 2018 National FFA Constitution and Bylaws Proposals

Earlier this week, National FFA Advisor Dr. Steve Brown distributed an official notification of the proposed 2018 National FFA Constitutional Amendments for consideration at the 91st National FFA Convention & Expo. Four proposals were included in this notification. All four proposed amendments will soon be posted on the National FFA Delegate webpage on FFA.org. An update to the 2017 Delegate Committee Recommendations can also be found on the delegate webpage under the "2017 Delegate Process" tab. This update includes responses to 2017 delegate recommendations by National FFA staff and was reviewed by the National FFA Board of Directors.

10. "Just for Owls in the Classroom" Monthly Email

Last week, the first edition of a monthly email geared toward agriculture teachers was sent. The purpose of the email series is to feature testimonials from teachers currently using our educator resources as well as showcase three resources each month.

11. AgExplorer Moves Past 3 Million Mark

AgExplorer has now had more than 3 million page views! In January alone, the site had more than 312,000 page views, which is nearly a 50 percent year-over-year increase in site traffic and more than 20,000 new visitors. In January, the most popular videos were the Animal Systems Spotlight and the on-

demand Zoetis Virtual Field Trip. More than 6,000 engagements took place on the Career Finder.

12. Alumni and Supporters Don't Slow Down – Even in Ice and Snow Storms

National FFA staff and National FFA Alumni and Supporter Advisory Committee members have been busy traveling the last couple of weeks. Three alumni and supporter events took place in one weekend alone. First, Ohio held their annual alumni convention, an action-packed weekend. Local Program Success Specialist Karen Hutchison and advisory committee member Ted Hughes Jr. attended this convention. Second, Executive Director of National FFA Alumni and Supporters Joshua Rusk attended the Wisconsin Annual FFA Alumni Convention. Josh shared greetings and presented informative workshops. The last event was the first of 11 National FFA Alumni and Supporters Regional Development Conferences (RDCs) in 2018, which took place in Bozeman, Mont. Allie Ellis, the FFA education specialist for the alumni team, presented at this conference. Advisory committee member Sid Freeman also attended and helped Allie as the regional representative of the membership in that area. Twenty-three attendees from six states participated in this first RDC.

RE: Proposed Constitutional Amendments for consideration by the Delegates at the

91st National FFA Convention & Expo in Indianapolis, Indiana, October 2018

The National FFA Advisor is to submit all proposed constitutional and bylaw amendments to the FFA state associations by March 1. (Article XVII, Amendments) Likewise, as per Article XVII, amendments must be submitted by January 1 for review by the National FFA Board of Directors.

The provisions have been met and the board is asking the delegates to consider the following four constitutional amendments this October.

2018 National FFA Constitutional Amendment Proposal A

For consideration by the delegates at the 91st National FFA Convention

Submitted by: New York State FFA Association and 2017-18 New York State FFA Officer Team

Subject: Changing the State FFA Degree Requirements

Motion: Move to amend the National FFA Constitution: Article VI. Degrees and Privileges of Active Membership, Section E by striking out, "(24 months)", add the words, "and paid dues for two years".

Rationale:

- 20% of FFA chapters in New York are Career and Technical Centers.
- Most Career and Technical Center agriculture/FFA programs are two-year programs. As a result, even
 though these students have paid their dues for two years and are extremely active members they will
 not meet the 24-month requirement by state conventions. This restricts members that have met all
 other requirements from achieving this recognition while still in high school.
- This change does not alter the integrity of the current state degree requirements; it keeps the
 requirements just as rigorous while allowing FFA members the opportunity to fully participate in our
 organization.
- The current 24-month requirement conflicts with when membership begins and when many state conventions are held across the nation.

Effect: Proposal would cause Article VI. Degrees and Privileges of Active Membership, Section E of the constitution to read: Have been an active FFA member and paid membership dues for two years (24 months) at the time of receiving the State FFA Degree.

2018 National FFA Constitutional Amendment Proposal B

For consideration by the delegates at the 91st National FFA Convention

Submitted by: National FFA Board of Directors, 2016-17, and 2017-18 National FFA Officers

Subject: Replacing the word "**Active**" with the word "**Student**"

Motion: Move to amend the National FFA Constitution: Article III. Organization; Article V.
 Membership; Article VI. Degrees and Privileges of Active Membership; and Article IX.
 National Officers and Procedures for Election; by replacing the word "active" with "student" and the word "kinds" with "types" in all occurrences.

Rationale: Student membership is a more inclusive descriptor regarding membership type. All student members should be active participants in FFA.

Effect: Replaces the word "active" with the word "student" and the word "kinds" with "types" in the following:

(**NOTE**: The National FFA Constitution wording below reflects the constitution at the time the proposal was submitted. Proposal B changes are noted. Other proposed amendments may modify the wording of these sections.)

Article III. Organization:

Section A.

It shall consist of chartered state associations composed of not less than four chapters chartered by a state association and having a total **active student** membership of not less than 125 members

Article V. Membership:

Section A.

Membership in the National FFA Organization shall be of three **kinds** types: **active** student, alumni and honorary.

Section B.

Active Student Membership - To be eligible for **active** membership in a chartered FFA chapter, a student must be enrolled in a secondary agricultural education program. State associations may consider "secondary agricultural education programs" to be grades 7-12.

To become an active student member and retain membership, a student must:

A member may retain **active student** membership until November 30, following the fourth National FFA Convention after graduation from high school.

Proposal B (continued)

Members using this waiver of service time for the purpose of maintaining **active** student membership for application for advanced degrees of membership must resume active participation within six months after having been honorably discharged from military service or completing their FFA international program and indicate such a desire by paying dues and attending meetings.

No individual may retain active student membership beyond his or her twenty-third birthday.

Section C.

Alumni Membership - Membership shall be open to former **active student** members and honorary members, present and former professional agricultural educators, parents of FFA members and others interested in and supportive of the FFA.

Article VI. Degrees and Privileges of Active Student Membership

Section A.

There shall be five degrees of active student membership based on individual achievement.

Section E.

2. Have been an active student FFA member for at least two years (24 months) at the time of receiving the State FFA Degree.

Section F.

1. Have received the State FFA Degree, have been an active student member for the past three years (36 months) and have a record of satisfactory participation in the activities on the chapter and state levels.

Article IX. National Officers and Procedures for Elections:

Section D.

The national officers shall hold the American FFA Degree at the time of their election and must be **active student** members for the duration of their term in office. They shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the delegates assembled at the national convention. A member cannot hold a national office and a state office at the same time.

2018 National FFA Constitutional Amendment Proposal C

Subject: Replacing the word "Alumni" with the word "Adult"

Motion: Move to amend the National FFA Constitution: Article V. Membership by replacing the word "Alumni" with "Adult".

Rationale: Adult membership is a more inclusive descriptor regarding membership type.

Effect: Modifies a constitutional form of membership with a more inclusive descriptor. Replaces the word "**Alumni**" with the word "**Adult**" in the following:

Article V. Membership:

Section A.

Alumni Adult Membership - Membership shall be open to former active members and honorary members award recipients, present and former professional agricultural educators, parents of FFA members and others interested in and supportive of the FFA.

2018 National FFA Constitutional Amendment Proposal D

Subject: Moving Honorary as National FFA membership kind to Degrees.

Motion: Move to amend the National FFA Constitution: Article V. Membership and Article VI. Degrees and Privileges of Active Membership by changing "honorary" from a membership kind to a degree.

Rationale: Differentiates between membership type and degrees and maintains the honorary degree recognition.

Effect: Changes the Constitution and will cause a change in the wording within the National FFA Honorary Degree Ceremonies.

Article V. Membership

Section A.

Replace the word "three" with the word "two" and strike the word "honorary".

Section C.

Replace "members" with "degree recipients".

Alumni Membership - Membership shall be open to former active members and honorary members degree recipients, present and former professional agricultural educators, parents of FFA members and others interested in and supportive of the FFA.

Move **Article V. Section E.** to **Article VI.** Degrees and Privileges of Active Membership and adding a **Section G**,

Section G.

Honorary **Membership FFA Degree** - Farmers, school superintendents, principals, members of boards of education, chapter advisors, teachers, staff members in agricultural education, business people and others who are helping to advance agricultural education and the FFA and who have rendered outstanding service, may be elected to **receive an** honorary **FFA degree membership** by a majority vote of the members present at any regular meeting or convention.

The Honorary membership FFA Degree shall be limited to the Honorary Chapter FFA Degree in the local chapter, Honorary State FFA Degree in the state association and the Honorary American FFA Degree in the national organization. All Honorary Degree recipients will be considered alumni/adult members as part of their Honorary Degree.

Rationale: Differentiates between membership type and degrees and maintains the honorary degree recognition.

Effect: Will cause a change in the wording within the FFA Honorary Degree Ceremonies.

2019-2020 National FFA Dues and Program Affiliation Fee Recommendation

Annually, National FFA dues and program affiliation fees are established by a vote of the delegates at the

national FFA convention and expo. The National FFA Board of Directors (Board) are to submit a recommendation regarding dues and program affiliation fees at least 45 days prior to the National FFA Convention per National FFA Constitution, Article XV. Dues, Section A. (See Below)

The Board has asked that the 2019-2020 National FFA dues and program affiliation fee recommendation be sent out at this time so that states have sufficient notice and time to consider the recommendation.

Article XV. Dues

Section A

Annual membership dues and program affiliation fees of the National FFA Organization shall be established by a majority vote of the delegates at the national convention. In the event the annual national convention is not held and/or the official delegates fail to set dues and program affiliation fees, the annual membership dues and program affiliation fees of the national organization will remain the same as the previous year. The National FFA Board of Directors shall submit its recommendation concerning dues and program affiliation fees to each state association at least 45 days prior to the National FFA Convention.

National FFA Dues and Program Affiliation Fee Recommendation

For consideration by the delegates at the 91st National FFA Convention & Expo

Submitted by: National FFA Board of Directors and 2017-18 National FFA Officers

Subject: National FFA Membership Dues and Program Affiliation Fee

Motion: Move to submit to the delegates at the 91st National FFA Convention a recommendation to set individual student dues for the 2019-2020 membership year at \$9 and increase the program affiliation fee by \$0.50 times the maximum quantity for each tier. (See 2019-2020 Program Affiliation Fee Chart, attached.) The eleven states who were early program affiliation adopters (AK, AZ, CA, CO, MA, MI, MT, NE, NJ, OK and PA) will be provided one additional year (until 2020-2021 school year) to implement the tier fee increase, providing time for the early program affiliation fee adopters, who are dependent on existing external funding, to seek and implement the tier increase.

Rationale: Dues have not increased in nearly a decade, even though the cost of services have increased and offered services have continued to improve to include items such as Ag Explorer and My Journey. In 2017, the National FFA Delegates directed the organization to work on its digital profile—both the website and a mobile application. The 2017 delegates recommended to the National FFA Organization to evaluate its programs to be reflective of innovations in agriculture and 21stcentury technology.

> To achieve this, the organization will need to increase its funding, resulting in an increase in membership dues and program affiliation fees. While increasing membership dues will help achieve this purpose, this is also an opportunity to encourage states to move to the affiliation model. This model would allow the organization to reach the goal of having all agricultural education students be a part of FFA and to experience the benefits of the three-component educational model.

> The National FFA Board of Directors recently declared a goal of program affiliation be the only type of membership offered by 2021 and the organization seek 100 percent participation in

program affiliation. Program affiliation would allow FFA to reach and engage more young people in FFA, benefitting both students, teachers and the wider industry of agriculture.

Effect: Provides necessary revenue to maintain and sustain National FFA Organization operations. Increases cost for individual student dues and program affiliation fees.

The program affiliation fee is assessed based on the total number of students/members within the agricultural education program and the tier range in which they fall. For example, a program with 80 students would fall in the 76-100 tier range and be charged \$590 under the new proposal. (100 maximum tier quantity x \$0.50 = \$50 + \$540 = \$590.00)

Frequently Asked Question for the Proposed Dues and Program Affiliation Fee Increase in 2019-2020

WHAT ARE CURRENT MEMBERSHIP DUES?

Currently, membership dues are \$7 per student member.

WHAT IS THE PROPOSED DUES INCREASE?

The proposed dues increase is \$2, raising the dues per student to a total of \$9.

WHEN WOULD THE INCREASE TAKE EFFECT?

The proposed increase in dues would occur for the 2019-2020 school year if passed by delegates at the 2018 National FFA Convention and Expo.

WILL PROGRAM AFFILIATION FEES INCREASE AS WELL AS MEMBERSHIP DUES?

Yes, there will be a proposed program affiliation fee increase of 50 cents per maximum tier quantity across all tiers. For example, in the 126-150 student/member tier the current fee is \$805.00; the new program affiliation fee will be \$880.00 -- $(150 \times .50) + $805.00 = 880.00 .

WHEN WILL THE PROGRAM AFFILIATION AND DUES INCREASE TAKE EFFECT?

For program affiliation chapters in states that are now partially affiliated, the increase would occur in 2019-2020 if passed by delegates at the 2018 National FFA Convention and Expo. For the 11 early adopter states (AK, AZ, CA, CO, MA, MI, MT, NE, NJ, OK and PA) that are presently 100 percent program affiliated, the fee increase will take effect for the 2020-21 school year.

WHY WILL THE FULLY PROGRAM AFFILIATED STATES HAVE A ONE YEAR DELAY IN THE INCREASE?

FFA is aware that some of the fully program affiliated states depend on state or legislative funding to pay their program affiliation fees. The organization wants to provide the early adopter states ample time to determine how to address the fee increase.

IS THE INCREASE IN DUES ALSO AN INCENTIVE FOR STATES TO BECOME AFFILIATED?

In essence, yes. Through program affiliation, FFA will be able to reach every student in agricultural education, truly reflecting the three-component agriculture education model. The proposed change in dues and program affiliation fees will also increase the organization's revenue stream in order to address ongoing demands for improvements such as electronic communication, website delivery, mobile applications, and continued improvements in our IT delivery to stakeholders. Delegates at the 2017 National FFA Convention and Expo directed the organization to make improvements in these areas to more effectively reach and serve student members.

WHY THE PUSH FOR PROGRAM AFFILIATION?

By moving away from individual membership to a program affiliation program, FFA can reach every student who is in agricultural education. This would then allow us to engage more students in FFA and elevate all students to be part of the three-component model of agricultural education.

WHAT IS THE HISTORY OF THE AFFILIATION PROGRAM?

In 2007, the National FFA Board of Directors passed a motion to form a task force to explore the possibility of a

program affiliation model. The objective of the program affiliation is to provide opportunities to every student in every agricultural education classroom every day. The program affiliation program allows all students in an agricultural education program to be FFA members and fully participate in the three-component model. The board of directors has stated their objective for the organization to become fully program affiliated by as soon as 2021.

HOW ARE PROGRAM AFFILIATION FEES PAID?

It is up to the discretion of the state and chapter to determine how they should pay for state and national dues. The National FFA Organization will not dictate or direct how the local chapter should do this.

WHEN WAS THE LAST TIME NATIONAL FFA INCREASED MEMBERSHIP DUES?

At the 2009 National FFA Convention & Expo, the delegates voted to increase dues by \$2 for the 2010-11 school year. Before that vote, dues were \$5.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS FOR ACHIEVING A DUES AND PROGRAM AFFILIATION FEE INCREASE?

Delegates will vote on the proposed dues and program affiliation fee increase during the 2018 National FFA Convention & Expo. If they vote to increase dues and program affiliation fees, the proposal will be shared with the board, which will ratify the motion passed by the delegates.

IF THE ORGANIZATION IS BEING FISCALLY RESPONSIBLE, WHY SHOULD WE NEED A DUES AND PROGRAM AFFILIATION FEE INCREASE?

It has been almost 10 years since the last member dues increase. The costs for the organization to provide programs, service and materials to members, along with the increasing need to stay relevant in today's digital world, have increased. The dues and program affiliation fee increase will allow the organization to create a revenue stream to address shortcomings in our electronic platforms that delegates directed the organization to address during the 2017 National FFA Convention & Expo—namely improving our website and adding a mobile application. We also intend to invest in ongoing improvements in our programming and ensuring our CDE/LDE and proficiency areas reflect and are more inclusive of 21st-century technology.

HOW LONG BEFORE THE ORGANIZATION PROPOSES ANOTHER DUES AND PROGRAM AFFILIATION FEE INCREASE?

Future proposed dues and program affiliation fee increases will be considered from time to time by the National FFA Board of Directors. Constitutionally, delegates will be called upon to consider dues and program affiliation fee proposals. It would seem reasonable for the organization to review dues and program affiliation fees at least every four years to manage the impact of an increase on members. If this were a cycle followed by the board, FFA members would experience no more than one dues or program affiliation fee increase-while in high school.

ARE THE NATIONAL DUES IN LINE WITH DUES FOR OTHER CAREER AND TECHNICAL STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS (CTSO)?

Yes, the proposed dues are in line with the current dues of other CTSOs, such as DECA, FBLA and SkillsUSA.
